

What is the telescope lending program?

The Snow Library Orion StarBlast Telescope may be lent out to patrons for viewing objects in the night sky, learning more about the solar system and developing an appreciation of the many wonders of the universe. The "tabletop" telescope is designed for the amateur star-gazer and requires some minor training to be used.

The program was made possible by Orleans residents Jarvis and Judith Hunt, who donated the telescope to the library. Jarvis, an astronomy enthusiast, was a science educator and a member of the Cape Cod Astronomical Society.

What do you need to borrow the 'scope?

You must be 18 or older.

You must have a **CLAMS library card** with fines not exceeding \$25.

You must view a telescope orientation video or be trained by library staff in the use of the 'scope before borrowing. Email Kaimi at klum@clamsnet.org to schedule a training.

You must read the terms of the telescope borrowing policy.

You must sign a user agreement accepting the terms of the policy each time you check out the telescope.

Lending terms

The loan period is 14 days with one renewal if no one is waiting.

Overdue fine for the telescope is \$5 per day.

If the telescope is returned damaged, the patron must pay for the cost of repairs.

The borrower is responsible for the telescope and all accessories loaned with it.
